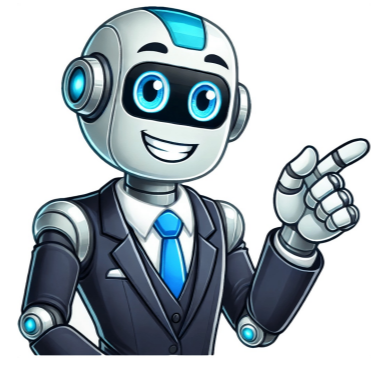


I'm human



Welcome to our Spanish grammar lesson on the Future Tense ("Futuro Simple"). This tense is used to talk about future actions and events. By the end of this lesson, you'll be able to conjugate verbs in the Future Tense and use them in sentences. We'll also explore another grammar structure called Near Future ("Futuro Próximo"), which helps us discuss the future in Spanish. To practice, you'll find a Quiz and Exercises at the end. Conjugating regular verbs in the Future Tense is easy: simply add the correct ending to the verb's Infinitive form. For example, let's look at the conjugations of "amar", "ser" and "sentir": * amarto - lovesterto - besentirto * youamaré - serés - sentiré * túamarás - serás-sentirás * élamará - será-sentirá * nosotrosamaremos - seremos-sentiremos * vosotrosamaréis - seréis-sentiréis * ellosamarán - serán-sentirán Irregular verbs follow the same pattern, but with an irregular stem. Some important irregular verbs include: * decirto say - dir-diré, dirás, dirá, diremos, diréis, dirán * haber (auxiliary verb) - habr-habré, habrás, habrá, habremos, habréis, habrán * hacerlo do - har-haré, harás, hará, haremos, haréis, harán * poder can - podr-podré, podrás, podrá, podremos, podréis, podrán * quererto want - querr-querré, querrás, querrá, querremos, querréis, querrán * saberto knows - abr-sabré, sabrás, sabrá, sabremos, sabréis, sabrán * salierto get out - saldr-saldré, saldrás, saldrá, saldremos, saldréis, saldrán * tenerto have - tendr-tendré, tendrás, tendrá, tendremos, tendréis, tendrán * venierto come - vendr-vendré, vendrás, vendrá, vendremos, vendréis, vendrán The Future Tense has some similarities with the Conditional Tense. We invite you to compare them and notice their similarities. Here are the main uses of the Future Tense: * El año que viene iré a América. (Next year I'll go to America.) * ¿Dónde estarás la semana que viene? (Where will you be next week?) * El profesor dirá algo mañana. (The teacher will say something tomorrow.) * En 2040 tendremos sesenta años. (In 2040 we'll be sixty years old.) * ¿Crees que el Real Madrid ganará la liga? (Do you think Real Madrid will win the league?) * El año que viene conocerás al hombre de tus sueños. (Next year you will meet the man of your dreams.) In some sentences, the condition is expressed in Present Tense, and the future consequence in Future Tense: * Si consigo un empleo, compraré una moto. (If I get a job, I'll buy a motorcycle.) * Si tú vienes, será más divertido. (If you come, it will be more fun.) Si Laura quiere bailar, iremos a la discoteca. Pero si ella prefiere quedarse en casa, podemos ver una película juntos. ¿Cómo es que se puede usar el Futuro Tense para hablar sobre cosas que podrían suceder ahora mismo? Bueno, como muestra las siguientes oraciones: Mi amigo Carlos está enfermo. Podría tener algún problema grave. Otra posibilidad para el futuro: el Futuro Próximo Aunque el Futuro Tense es útil para hablar sobre el futuro, también podemos usar otro sistema gramatical llamado Futuro Próximo ("Futuro Proximus") para hablar sobre lo que sucederá pronto. Para formar el Futuro Próximo, conjugamos el verbo ir en Presente (voy, vas, va, vamos, vais, van), seguido de la preposición a y el infinitivo del verbo que expresa la acción. Por ejemplo, aquí están los verbos "jugar" y "comer" en Futuro Próximo: jugar comer voy a jugar voy a comer tú vas a jugar tú vas a comer él va a jugar él va a comer nosotros vamos a jugar nosotros vamos a comer vosotros vais a jugar vosotros vais a comer ellos van a jugar ellos van a comer Algunos ejemplos del Futuro Próximo: La semana que viene voy a viajar a Colombia. Mañana vamos a trabajar muy duro. ¿Cuándo vas a llamar a David? Both regular and irregular verbs are used in this tense. We hope you can get the best out of this material. Lets start... Students could work individually or in pairs to solve the exercises on this worksheet. As it is explained on top of this worksheet, the future tense of Spanish verbs is generally formed by following some specific conjugation rules, modifying the original ending of the verbs (-AR, -ER or -IR) depending on the subject of the sentence. Unlike other tenses, the new endings will be exactly the same for any regular verb. In the future, we will also find irregular verbs like HABER or TENER, so always double-check the form of some verbs. To solve the first exercise, students must complete the chart on the worksheet containing a list of 10 common verbs using the right conjugations for these verbs in the simple future in Spanish. Some of them are regular, whereas others are irregular, so they could use a conjugation tool to double-check the right form of the verbs in the "futuro simple" to make sure they are using the right form. As for the second exercise, students must fill in the blanks using the future form of the verbs in parentheses, making sure the sentences make grammatical sense in Spanish. They must choose a place and the top 5 things they will do there during their time in that place. Once they have planned it, they should present for rest of the class, making sure to use as many sentences in the simple future tense in Spanish as possible, for example: ¡Hola! Mi amigo y yo viajaremos a Italia. Es un país genial en Europa. (Hello! My friend and I are traveling to Italy. It's a great country in Europe.) Yo tomaré muchas fotos durante el viaje y él visitará a algunos amigos. (I will take a lot of photos during the trip and he will visit some friends.) To head to the office, you'll need to use the future tense correctly for both regular and irregular verbs in Spanish. For instance, instead of saying "tendré" (meaning I'll have), you would say "tendré" is not an option but "tendrás" or "tendra", whereas "salir" also has a different form like "saldrá". To tackle the exercises, students should first fill in the correct conjugations of 12 common verbs on the worksheet. Utilizing a conjugation tool can help ensure accuracy. For the second exercise, they must complete sentences using the future tense forms of irregular verbs in parentheses while maintaining grammatical correctness.
