Tylan Soluble is a tylosin tartrate BP (Vet) soluble powder for oral solution, with each bottle containing 100 g of tylosin activity. It's used to prevent and treat bovine pneumonia associated with certain bacteria, control Mycoplasma synoviae airsacculitis in chickens and turkeys, and reduce infection levels after stress from live vaccination. The medication is also effective in controlling outbreaks of necrotic enteritis caused by Clostridia perfringens in chickens and preventing enzootic pneumonia, swine dysentery, and other scours in pigs. For calves, the recommended dosage is one gram of Tylan Soluble administered orally twice daily for 7-14 days, which can be added to their milk or reconstituted milk replacer. In chickens and turkeys, the medication is given in drinking water at a concentration of 0.5 g per liter, with varying dosages depending on age, weight, and water consumption. Specific treatment programs are recommended for mycoplasmosis prevention in chickens and turkeys, as well as for treating mycoplasmosis and controlling necrotic enteritis in chickens. The medication can be used for 5 days at a concentration of 0.15 g per liter to control outbreaks of necrotic enteritis in chickens. Given article text here Tylan Soluble is given to pigs for 3-10 days at 25 mg/kg bodyweight by adding 0.25g per litre, with the goal of preventing and controlling swine dysentery and enzootic pneumonia. The dosage for ileitis treatment is between 5-10 mg/kg bodyweight, achieved by adding 0.05 - 0.1g per litre. Treatment with a medicated drinking solution should last until symptoms have cleared up normally within 3 to 10 days. Veterinarians must review the diagnosis after five days of medication if no improvement is observed. Do not use Tylan Soluble for more than three days, keep it out of reach of children, and ensure only animals under treatment receive this product. Tylosin is widely used in poultry to combat Gram-negative infections, mainly targeting gastrointestinal issues in chickens, turkeys, swine, and small mammals. A comparison with metronidazole reveals tylosin's longer term safety profile, making it a more suitable alternative for prolonged treatment. For administering tylosin to chickens, a standard regimen involves treating them for 3-5 days, depending on the severity of infection. During this period, medicated water should be provided at a rate of 50 mg per pound of body weight daily.
